I've stayed touch with the Clinages (Charla, Ron & Patrick) over the years.

I was sorry to hear about Ron's health issues.

Below is a response from Charla:

Regrettably, we didn't have a potluck this year and probably won't have any more. As much as we love seeing everyone, it's just too much for me to do alone and Ron is not up to it. I don't remember if we spoke about it at last year's get-together, but Ron was diagnosed with MDS and began chemo this past February. MDS is a bone marrow disorder that doesn't produce enough red blood cells and also creates mutated ones. Eventually the disease turns into leukemia, and apparently Ron is going to be on chemo for the rest of his life, although they are hopeful that each treatment will be stretched out longer than the once a day for 7 days and 21 days between. He hasn't been getting physically ill anymore but he is just doesn't feel well and is extremely exhausted all the time. He just got out of Wooster Hospital 2 weeks ago from severe dehydration and weakness. They released him with the condition that home health physical therapy comes in. He's getting chemo and blood transfusions at Wade Park VA.

I didn't mean to write a book, just wanted you to know what's going on here. Love you all. Hope to see you sometime. Miss you!!

Operation Christmas Child (OCC) is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their own communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. They ship these simple gifts outside the United States to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease.

OCC is a global program facilitated through hundreds of thousands of trained volunteers. Local believers in more than 170 countries deliver OCC shoebox gifts, present the Gospel, and facilitate a follow-up discipleship program, The Greatest Journey. With this approach, local Christians who know the culture and language best are given effective resources with a solid biblical foundation to share the Gospel in their communities. Ministry partners—local pastors or church leaders—are equipped to be volunteer representatives and are provided thorough, detailed training to be able to facilitate a shoebox outreach event and present the Gospel.

Through the loving friendship and leadership of Advent's Beverly Cummings and Romi Oliva of North Olmsted Evangelical Friends Church, Advent is participating in this year's shoebox campaign aligned with Friends Church. Bev and Romi are project leaders at Advent to mobilize our efforts to fill and provide shoeboxes. National collection week is November 18 – 25. Shoeboxes and instructions are available in the Narthex. All are invited to take one or more boxes to support this outreach ministry.
